Mr.Knottnerus brought me in march 1944 to the farm of the Lievestro family. The name of the farm was "De Profiet" situated in the village of Westendorp in Holland. Before that date I never knew this family. They have hidden me during eleven months.

During daytime I was in a separate room, during the night I slept in a hay garret upstairs in the barn.

Financial arrangements were very low. I only had to pay for the cost of food. I do not know the amount involved as this was arranged by Mr.P. van den Berg, a non Jewish friend of my parents. Mr. van den Berg is no more alife.

The motivation of the Lievestro family was: helping people to save their lives.

Because I was in a separate room I never saw neighbours or other family members, except their children. The children knew knew that I was Jewish and that it was dangerous for their parents to hide me.

However they still were young they never told anybody about my stay at there home.

I had a very good relationship with the Lievestro family.

After the war we kept a good contact with each other. Mr. Lievestro died one or two years after the war.

The lievestro family saved many people.
