Enclosed is a short story of my experiences during World War II. My name is Herbert Klaber. I was born as the youngest of 6 children in the German town of Borken in Westfalen, March 19, 1920. My parents, Max and Regina Klaber were killed in the Holocaust. Also my brother Albert.

As you can read in my story, I was saved by the Family Lievestro in Varsseveld, The Netherlands. Hendrikus and Dina Lievestro are not living anymore. I am in contact with their oldest daughter Hanna Kelderman. She is married and has a large family. Her husband Hank used to work for the Dutch Railroad, but is retired now. Their address is: Fam. H. Kelderman, Alexanderstraat 103, 6812 B D, Arnhem, The Netherlands.

It would be a great joy for me if that family maybe together with the rest of the family would be honored they deserve so well. I also mention in my story the son of the Protestant Minister in Varsseveld. His name is Reinout Knottnerus.

I remember that Mrs. Frieda Rosenbaum and her son Ernst were saved by the Family Jan Willem Wolsing in Westendorp, The Netherlands. The name Johan Hiddink is not familiar to me.

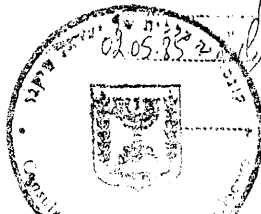
Frieda Rosenbaum lives at: Beth Zikna, Beek Straat 40, Arnhem.
